Inspire the conversation on the climate challenge with Climanosco

Climanosco's mission is to make climate science accessible to everyone.

One way we do this is by supporting researchers and citizens around the world in paraphrasing climate research so that it is readily understandable to a broad audience.

Another way we aim to do this is by collaborating with artists who create work that inspires and elevates the conversation on climate change and related societal challenges.

This year, we are launching our first call for visual artists in concert with our call for scientific manuscripts with the aim to create a uniquely inspirational collection.

We invite you to join our efforts with this call for artists around the theme of the past, present and future human responses to climate change.

Participation offers:

- The opportunity to share your art with a new, diverse audience
- The presentation of your art work in an exhibition and its participation in an auction in 2020
- The sale of prints of your art work in our online shop
- The chance to have an impact on the public discourse about the climate challenge

Art works should be original and specifically created for this call for artists. As artist, you are free to choose the style and how your work will reflect this call's theme. The format is free, except that it should reasonably allow digitalization and shipping.

The three top art works will win exciting prizes!

The deadline for finalizing works is 31 May 2020.

Please [notify us](#) of your intention to participate as soon as possible but no later than 23 January 2020.

How to participate

Who can participate?

We welcome participants across all forms of visual arts and all career stages.

First, notify us of your intent to participate (deadline 23 January 2020)

Send us an email as soon as possible at call-2020@climanosco.org with:

- a description or a sketch of your project for this call;
- your portfolio or an example of your art work in the area of visual arts.

By sending a notification of intent, you indicate that you commit to create a piece of art by the due date (see below) that will satisfy the following conditions:

- it is original and signed by you, the artist;
- it is specifically created for this call;
- its format reasonably allows digitalization and shipping;
- it will participate in an exhibit and an auction organized by Climanosco in 2020;
- Climanosco is licensed the right to produce and sell copies of the artwork.

The style and how it reflects the theme are your free choices.

We will be in touch with you within a few days of receiving your notification of intent.

Send your original art work (deadline 31 May 2020)

We suggest that you keep us updated as you progress on your project and we require that you finalize it by 31 May 2020.

Once your art work is finalized, please get in touch with us at call-2020@climanosco.org. We will organize shipping and digitalization with you.

Prizes

After reception of all pieces of art, a jury will be elected by the Board of Directors to choose the three top art works and award the prizes to the winners. The prizes are as follows:

1. First prize: CHF 1000
2. Second prize: CHF 500
3. Third prize: CHF 500

The cash prizes will be sent to the winners by bank transfer. It is the responsibility of the participants to make sure that they have access to a bank account where the prizes can be deposited. It is the responsibility of the winners to declare the prizes to the tax authorities in their country. The prizes will be delivered independently of the possible sale of the art works at the auction organized by Climanosco.
